Hitachi Comments on fine imposed by European Commission for violation of EC Treaty ban on restrictive business practices

Tokyo, October 7, 2009 --- Hitachi, Ltd. (NYSE:HIT / TSE:6501) today commented on the fine imposed by the European Commission for violation of EC Treaty ban on restrictive business practices.

October 7, 2009, the European Commission has ordered Hitachi to pay a fine of 2,460,000 euros (approx. 320 million yen) for infringement of EU anti-trust rules regarding high voltage transformer equipment business, which Hitachi had exited several years ago.

Hitachi will carefully review the substance of the Commission's decision and consider the correspondence in the future. Hitachi cannot judge the effect of this matter on business results at this point.
